WHEREAS: Proactive care coordination assistants (PCCAs) play a key role in coordinating care for at-risk patients and preventing them from being overlooked, by reducing barriers and arranging preventative screenings or chronic disease follow-up appointments at the patient's medical home:

AND WHEREAS: Since formally introducing the PCCA program in Alberta in 2024, the PCCA model has been implemented in eight Primary Care Networks across the province and influenced many others to adopt the core elements of patient outreach;

AND WHEREAS: November 10, 2025 will mark three years since the launch of the PCCA program at the Edmonton Southside Primary Care Network:

AND WHEREAS: The Government of Alberta recognizes the work of care coordination teams, including PCCAs, whose proactive efforts in primary care help to improve care continuity, access, and equity for Albertans.
